Indications for specialist referral

- Renal colic
- · Positive imaging for stones

Referral information required

- Pain: duration, type
- Complications: haematuria, UTI, renal impairment

Investigations required

- CT KUB (Ultrasound renal tract if CT KUB unavailable)
- MSU
- FBC, EUC, calcium, uric acid

Initial management

- Pain relief: indomethacin
- Antibiotics if clinical suspicion of urinary tract infection (commence antibiotics after taking samples of MSU)

'Red Flag' items

- Pain not relieved with simple analgesics
- Suspicion of sepsis: elevated WCC, reduction in eGFR, fever with chills/rigors
