Information

STI's continue to be part of sexual health landscape with many conditions being asymptomatic.

GP's and Primary Practices see the majority of people within the 'at risk' populations. In order to reduce the spread of STI's we encourage GP's to normalise STI screening in their practice to include:

- Men who have Sex with Men (MSM)
- Young people < 30 years
- Aboriginal People
- Sex Workers
- People Who Inject Drugs (PWID)
- Pregnant people
- Anyone who has had a recent change in partners
- Symptoms (self or partner)
- Previous STI infection or,
- Patient requests a test.
